

JMN 5TH EVENT – SANTIAGO DE CHILE – INTERNAL WORKSHOP REPORT

On Wednesday, January 9th 2019 the 5th internal workshop of Jean Monnet Network Crisis Equity Democracy was held at the ECLAC commission, in Santiago, Chile. The internal workshop gathered the two coordinators of the network, Christian Ghymers and Bettina Guilherme, as well as one representant of each institute partner of the network.

First, Bettina Guilherme and Christian Ghymers reminded the purpose of the network and of the internal workshop. They explained the opportunity they got for organizing the event at the ECLAC commission, some difficulties which appeared for the date chosen by ECLAC, but thanks to the help of Stefany Griffith-Jones who mobilized her direct contacts in Santiago, and together with Christian Ghymers who has also useful contacts as a past-officer in ECLAC, the event looks attractive.

Then, technical points about the international seminar held by the network on the following day (Thursday January 10th) were discussed, such as taping the seminar, security checks, coffee breaks and cocktail. Christian Ghymers also went through the programme of the international seminar in order to explain the purpose of each of the four session. Moreover, he presented each of the speakers to the network and made a short overview of what specific point each of them would raise and discuss. Regarding the speakers from the network, their speech was discussed within the internal workshop in order to agree on the arguments the network would be tackling during the international seminar.

Then, the internal workshop opened to a session of discussions over the book the network will be publishing at the end of the network period, that is in June 2019. First, the partners talked about the development of their research. Then, Co-coordinators insisted upon the need to strengthen the coherence and structure of the book. The team answered by processing and modifying article titles and merging similar chapters together. The new structure of the book the partners came up with comprised five bigger chapters comprising subchapters. After the long process, the partners discussed their papers in order to get insights from their peers.
